Eleventh Day of *January* in the Year of
our LORD One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy *Nine*

THE Condition of this Obligation is such,
That if the above bounden *Catherine Smith & Henry Smith*

Administrators
of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of *Yost Smith*
deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and
singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, which have or
shall come to the Hands, Possession or Knowledge of *them* the said *Catherine
Smith & Henry Smith*

or unto the Hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for *them* and
the same so made do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the Register's Office,
in the County of *Chester* at or before the *Eleventh* Day of
February next ensuing; and the same Goods, Chattels and Credits, and all
other the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, at the Time of his
Death, which at any Time after shall come to the Hands or Possession of the said
Catherine Smith and Henry Smith

or into the Hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for *them* do well
and truly administer according to Law. And further, do make, or cause to be made,
a true and just Account of *their* said Administration, at or before the *Eleventh*
Day of *January 1780* - And all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods, Chattels
and Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Administrators Account
(the same being first examined and allowed of by the Orphans Court of the County
of *Chester County*) shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons
respectively as the said Orphans Court by their Decree or Sentence, pursuant to
