This Indenture made the Twenty second day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty four (1864) Between Orlando Thrist of the City of Palisade in the State of New Jersey Carpenter and Fanny his wife of the one part and Mathew Beaumont of the City of Philadelphia Woolen Manufacturer of the other part, Witnesseth that the

said Orlando Thrist and Fanny his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Thousand Dollars lawful money of the United States of America unto them well and truly paid by the said Mathew Beaumont at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold aliened infeoffed released and confirmed and by these presents Do grant bargain sell alien infeoff release and confirm unto the said Mathew Beaumont his heirs and assigns, All that certain Factory Messuage and lot or tract of Ground situate in the Township of Charlestown in the County of Chester and State of Pennsylvania Bounded and described as follows;

Beginning at a Limestone Set by Thrift, Kenney and Dairy instead of a post near a large White Oak thence by land of Daniel Kenney and Jacob Rixtime north East One hundred and four perches to a Hickory being a corner of the Meeting house lot and by land of the heirs of Jacob Nyee South East sixteen perches; thence by the same and land of John Morony South twenty degrees and a half East ninety four perches to a Stone Set for a corner in a public Road thence along said Road South thirty two degrees and a half west ten perches to a Limestone Set by Orlando Thrift and Nathaniel Davis instead of a Stone; thence by land of Moses King and N Davis South forty degrees East thirty four perches and eight tenths to a heap of stones thence by land of John Sheldrake South West forty two perches to a heap of stones; thence by land of Peter Geeny North ten degrees West sixty one and a half perches to a Maple standing on the South Branch of Pickering Creek and by the same land North eighty five degrees West thirty five perches to the place of Beginning Containing Fifty seven acres and sixty eight perches of land & Excepting out of the same a Lot of Eighty Square perches of land which William Umpleby a former Owner Conveyed to John W Mc Curdy and others for the purpose of erecting a Meeting house thereon by Deed duly Executed and recorded in the Records Office of Chester County in Deed Book N 4 vol. page 311 &c.
